The health department is pleased to present to you, the 2013 Annual Report. This report is a summary of the services provided to Jasper County residents by the health department.

We play a primary role in disease prevention and health promotion. Quality of life is enhanced, as health department staff provides an array of services. Those services include communicable disease prevention, food and water safety, immunizations, health screenings, and behavioral health counseling and intervention.

New to our health department this year, through the Illinois Association of Public Health Administrators, trained three staff members to help uninsured Jasper and Richland County residents attain health insurance through the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace. Staff also assisted others who qualified for the expanded Medicaid.

Since the Jasper County Health Department is moving toward the premise that all residents will have either health insurance or Medicaid our behavioral health department is credentialed and has contracts with several insurances. They are now able to bill insurance. Our nursing department has initiated the credentialing and contracting process and will be able to bill health insurance in 2015.

We would like to sincerely thank the Jasper County Board of Health, the Jasper County Board, all elected and appointed officials, and especially our staff and volunteers. I would also like to thank those that worked on the Community Needs Assessment and Health Plan extending our certification period to October 2017. Thanks also go out to the other community organizations, governmental agencies and citizens of Jasper County for your support and guidance.

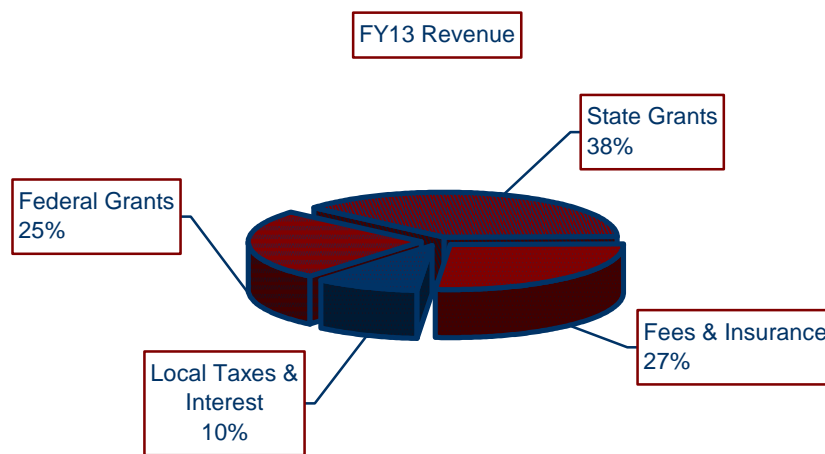
